Berrybrook Primary School Well-Being Room

Thursday 10th of October marked Mental Health Day and Berrybrook Primary School were delighted to open their new well-being room in conjunction with this celebration. This unique room acts as an oasis of calm for children in school who may feel overwhelmed by any issues outside and inside of school. Inside the room are sensory toys, lego and comfy seating to help them unwind when things get a bit too much for them. This new space is there to be used by the children whenever they need some time out for themselves.

Previously when children became distressed or anxious in lessons, they would leave the classroom and stand in the corridor.

This new room was officially opened by Megan Reece, who found fame on the television show—The Voice in 2016. Megan, mother of five children said,

“When I was asked by the school to open the room I immediately said yes as mental health is very close to my heart.

It’s reassuring as a parent for me to see that schools like this are taking the children’s health into consideration and thinking about their futures in terms of health as well as education.

The well-being room shows the children that they’re supported and that help is there for them when they need it, which is something they can take with them into later life. I know I’d have loved something like this”.

Megan performed two songs for the children ‘Ride Up’ by Andra Day and ‘Empire State of Mind’ by Alicia Keys which were chosen to reflect the topic of the day.



Mental Health Celebrations at Woodthorne Primary School

Everyone at Woodthorne Primary School had an amazing day in school on Mental Health Day, raising both awareness and funds for Mental Health.

The day began with a whole-school staff breakfast together, then everyone in school walked a mile.

Children across all year groups enjoyed a range of mental health-themed activities.

The school sold fruit as snacks and bookmarks the children had made.

In total the school raised an impressive total of **£471.91**. This will be split between Young Minds and the School for Mental Health Provisions.



HAND IN HAND FOR OSCAR

Stanley Road Primary School held an own-clothes day to raise funds for a local boy in Worcester called Oscar. Oscar is a 5 year old boy who has T-cell Acute Lymphoblastic leukaemia. Sadly, Oscar's recent stem cell transplant hasn't cured him, meaning that he urgently needs further treatment that the NHS cannot fund. His parents desperately need help in raising £500,000 to fund either a second transplant or enrolment onto Car-T therapy in Singapore. They say that if Oscar does not receive this treatment by November it may be too late. Last Friday, Stanley Road managed to raise an amazing **£607!** Further fundraising is happening across Worcester and they have so far achieved 91% of the target amount. Rhys's mother made a public plea asking people to send a birthday card to Rhys for his 14th birthday, who had recently told his mother he had 'Had enough of life', to help show him he has something to live for.

Alfie Baugh, son of Nicola Baugh (Senior Lunchtime Supervisor at Berrybrook Primary School) was really touched by this story and asked his mom to help get the Trust schools on board so that we could help him to get as many birthday cards as we could together for Rhys.

Staff and children from schools within the Trust were more than happy to get involved by making and buying cards and writing kind words and messages of encouragement to Rhys. In total we managed to contribute over 300 cards to the 927 cards collected for Rhys by Alfie.

It has been wonderful to read the news updates which have shown Rhys, getting great pleasure and comfort from opening a staggering 18,000 birthday cards from people all over the world!

The children took part in warm up activities such as start jumps, heel flicks, high knees and criss-cross legs.

Overall, the children loved the opportunity to see how an athlete's career starts and develops. They discussed the hard work, endeavour and motivation it takes to make it to the highest level of competitive athletics and sport.

The whole day was also a sponsored event raising £1900! The money raised has been sent to support Team GB and a small proportion will be given back to school for sports equipment.

INTER-MAT FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT

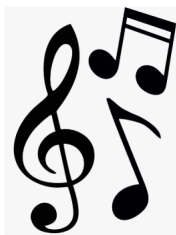
