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## RSE: Update and preparing for Statutory status

The Children and Social Work Act 2017 introduced new legislation on relationships and sex education (RSE) to all schools in England. Statutory Relationships Education and Sex Education comes into effect from September 2020, although the DfE is strongly encouraging schools that are ready to start teaching the new curriculum to do so from September 2019.

This course aims to give an update on these pending changes. It will help delegates to evaluate their school's current RSE provision and reflect upon this in relation to wider considerations in school, along with the need to ensure best practice based on local priorities.

The session will enable delegates to:

- Become familiar with new statutory guidance around relationships education and sex education and important milestones to 2020
- Begin to evaluate the impact this will have on their own practice in school
- Understand how they can best prepare for the new statutory guidance, including involving the wider school community

This training is suitable for school-based staff from all phases of school who deliver RSE but will be of particular interest to SLT members, RSE/PHSEe coordinators and other staff with a strategic responsibility for these areas.
